CHAPTER OF MINISTERS LETTER

Dear Fraternity Minister,

I am writing to announce the convocation of our Regional Chapter of Ministers which had been scheduled originally for November 10 and postponed in the aftermath of hurricane Sandy. The Chapter will meet on <u>Saturday, January 19th, 2013.</u>

It is the serious responsibility of every fraternity minister to be present or to send a delegate to the Chapter meeting in their place.

The Chapter of Ministers is the meeting of the full Regional Council of our Regional Fraternity—the highest governmental body of our Regional Fraternity. Article 63 of the General Constitutions of the Secular Franciscan Order defines the Regional Chapter in the following way, "

The regional chapter is the representative organ of all the fraternities existing within the confines of a regional fraternity, with elective and deliberative power."

This is the Regional Council which is constituted by all of the local fraternity ministers within our Regional Fraternity together with the members of the Regional Executive Council.

As the elected local minister of your fraternity, one of your most serious responsibilities to the Order is to represent your local fraternity at this annual meeting and in this way participate in the governance of the Regional Fraternity.

Our principal speaker for the on-going formation portion of our meeting will be Sister Lillian Alam, FMM. Sister was formerly a staff member with Franciscans International and is currently on the Pastoral staff at Holy Name of Jesus Church, 96th Street in New York. She will address the issues surrounding human trafficking.

This year, the Chapter of Ministers meeting will take place at St. Francis of Assisi Church in the San Damiano Hall, 129 West 31st Street, New York, NY 10001. The local fraternity should reimburse the local minister or delegate for any expense involved for transportation to and from this meeting.

There will be time for dialogue with your fellow fraternity ministers and Regional leadership, setting the future direction of our Region, and of course, we will also engage in the important business items before the Chapter including the Regional Budget.

In order to prepare yourself for the discussion, I ask that you please review the enclosed documents: -the proposed agenda/schedule of the day (SEE PAGE 4)

-the directions to reach St. Francis of Assisi Church in New York City are posted on our website.

Please be sure to complete the attendance form (posted on our website) indicating either your attendance or naming a delegate to represent your fraternity. A delegate should be a member of your local fraternity council but if this is not possible, then they must, at least, be a permanently professed member. Every fraternity must be represented at this important meeting. Please be sure to complete and send this form even if you sent one in earlier in preparation for the November meeting which was canceled. As different circumstances may mean different observers, or delegates or whether you will be able to represent your fraternity, you must re-submit this form to Kate Asselin, OFS, Regional Secretary, by January 5th, at the address indicated on the form.

Any member of the Secular Franciscan Order is welcome to attend this meeting as an observer. You must indicate the name of any observer who plans to attend on the form. There is no cost for attendance at this meeting. You are requested to bring your own lunch.

I look forward to seeing you on January 19th, 2013 at St. Francis of Assisi Church, San Damiano Hall in New York City, NY. Please pray for the success of our Chapter.

I think it is well worth our effort to encourage this relationship and hopefully, it will attract some of the Sisters and Brothers to consider the Spiritual Assistant ministry among us.

Francis' rule contains the "stuff" of the future. Early Franciscans were not recognized for a particular work, their way of life was their message and every member had a part to play in living out the message. Hopefully, the Franciscan Federation is characterized by the same

With this in mind, we are offering membership to the various fraternities of our Secular Franciscan sisters and brothers so that we widen our membership base to include all followers of the Third Order Rule. The cost of membership is \$20.00 which is the cost for each individual sister/brother in the member communities of the Federation. As members of the Federation you will receive our monthly newsletter **Musings** which contains information on Federation activities, Commission work, Region workshops, job openings and Franciscan resources as well as listings of retreats and presentations offered throughout the country. Using an online electronic newsletter provides the capability to link information posted on the Federation website, on websites of retreat centers, universities and colleges and other organizations with whom the Federation continues to network. You will also be given membership rates for our Annual Federation Conference.

The AFC 2012 (Annual Federation Conference) was held in Cincinnati, Ohio on July 27—July 30, 2012. The theme of the Conference was "Releasing Energies to Love: Creative Fidelity in the Church" with keynote presenters: Marelene Weisenbeck, FSPA and Joseph P. Chinnici, OFM. Our presenters looked at "current experiences in our fractured and wounded church through the lens of the call to creative fidelity and its application within our Franciscan tradition."

Next year the AFC 2013 will be held at the Marriott Pittsburgh City Center, July 17—22, 2013. The theme of the conference is "Franciscan Life in Evolution" and the presenters are Ilia Delio, a well known Franciscan author and Keith Warner, OFM.

The Federation is only beginning to appreciate the depth and breadth of the transformation occurring as we begin responding in new ways to our experience of the holy in our midst. We are called to a new exploration of the struggles and possibilities that a Franciscan vision suggests. We embody the hope that we can live out the Third Order Rule to the benefit of all.

Two Goals for Your New Year

When I was in college, I dreaded semester finals. Sometimes, I had three finals on one day.

When I graduated, I was glad because I thought my testing days were over. I was wrong.

As I have grown older, I have come more and more to look at life itself as a test. Each day, year, and decade tests my integrity and my honesty, my willingness to follow Jesus. They test my ability to develop long-lasting and loving relationships. They test my desire to attain the maximum that God has for me during my life. They test my ability to love and nurture my marriage and my family. The tests of life do not end with graduation. In fact, they go on—even until the end of our days.

But I've found something that helps me to approach these tests in the different areas of my life. It's the simple strategy of setting goals. We need goals. They help us stay focused and on course.

And so, at the beginning of each new year, my wife Felicia and I go out. We set aside a special time to review the previous year and to set our goals for the new year. We do not end until we have covered five primary areas: our marriage, our children, our finances, our health, and our spiritual life with God.

I encourage you to discover the power of goal-setting for yourself. Take some time to identify your goals for the year. Write them down, and measure your plans on a quarterly basis. Plans and goals grow more accurate over time as we address them and adjust them.

Make it one of your goals to pray. If you don't already pray every day, try your best to set aside some time and sit with Jesus even for just ten minutes each day. Tell him that you want to stay close to him all year long and that you will do your best to let nothing separate you from his love.

Which brings me to the second goal. In the coming year, all of us will once again face a series of tests and trials. Although these will vary from one person to another, here is a general principle that can guide all of us as we move ahead toward the Lord. The principle is this: No matter what comes your way—good or bad, happy or sad—be sure to "let nothing separate you from the love of Christ" (Romans 8:35).

If it's increased income, a new house, success, pleasure, a big promotion or whatever, do not let it separate you from the love of God. If it's sickness, suffering, loss of a job, problems at home, or whatever, do not let it separate you from God. Let nothing—not even your own weaknesses, failures, and sin—separate you from the love of God.

Incorporate this sound piece of advice into your family plan for this new year. Make it your goal to let nothing separate or divide your marriage and your family. Make it your family goal to put on love and to let your love cover the multitude of weaknesses that are in your family and in every family (1 Peter 4:8).

May God bless us all, as we begin this new year!
