


Take a minute Picture the best Secular Franciscan Servant Leaders you know personally or have known in the past



The leader (conductor) cannot make music without the orchestra! Each musician has a special talent.


The leader draws all the talents together to make a beautiful piece of music There might be a solo here and there, but everyone works together toward one goal—with the leader as the organizer



Talents of Servant Leader: (Be yourself and allow others to be themselves.)

- Acknowledges and encourage fraternity members to grow
- Recognizes and respects the true worth of every brother and sister
- Shows **empathy** for fraternity members
- Sets the example of living the Gospel; demonstrates Franciscan joy; spirit of daily conversion; strong prayer life
- Places the needs of the fraternity before personal needs

They are examples of fair play, integrity and dependability




Talents of Servant Leader:

- Is willing to accept new ideas as suggested by members of the fraternity
- Is able to communicate a sense of ownership and accountability to fraternity members—collaboration and teamwork (develops commitment)
- · Is able to develop new leaders while leading
- Is able to focus and mobilize the energy of the fraternity
- Possesses communication skills that pull the fraternity together
- Etiquette: Communication also includes ability to genuinely listen to the needs and feedback and suggestions of all fraternity members



Leadership Etiquette

- Understands that their position is not one of glory but of responsibility and service
- Willing to help other fraternity members who are having difficulties
- Makes decisions that will enhance the entire fraternity not just him/herself
- **REMEMBER:** Whatever power a servant leader has was given to him/her by the Holy Spirit through the action of the fraternity members



Sacrifice personal glory for the benefit of the entire fraternity

Cannot be successful without the collaboration of the entire group

COLLABORATION; COMMUNITY; COMMUNICATION; COMMITMENT AND CONVERSION (With formation and prayer as the heartbeat)
