• Mt. 10:5-15:5^b Jesus sent out these twelve* after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. 6^c Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. 7As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' 8^c Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give. 9^c Do not take gold or silver or copper for your belts; 10^c no sack for the journey, or a second tunic, or sandals, or walking stick. The laborer deserves his keep. 11^c Whatever town or village you enter, look for a worthy person in it, and stay there until you leave. 12As you enter a house, wish it peace. 13If the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it; if not, let your peace return to you. 14^c 14^c 14 Whoever will not receive you or listen to your words—go outside that house or town and shake the dust from your feet. 15Amen, I say to you, it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah on the day of judgment than for that town.

Discernment

- God's Will--Fate or a "Godly Dream?
- Ephesians 1:3-14
- Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴ just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. ⁵ He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. ⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace ⁸ that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight ⁹ he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, ¹⁰ as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. ¹¹ In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, ⁶ having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹² so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³ In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴ this d is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

God's Dream—His Long-Range Plan

- Dynamic, Evolving Dream for us
- Eph. 1:3-14 from The Message (scriptural paraphrase)
- How blessed is God! And what a blessing He is! He's the Father of our Master, Jesus Christ, and takes us to the high places of blessing in him. Long before he laid down earth's foundations, he had us in mind, had settled on us as the focus of his love, to be made whole and holy by his love. Long, long ago he decided to adopt us into his family through Jesus Christ. (What pleasure He took in planning this!) He wanted us to enter into the celebration of his lavish gift-giving by the hand of his beloved Son...

(Ephesians 1 continued)

He thought of everything, provided for everything we could possibly need, letting us in on the plans he took such delight in making. He set it all out before us in Christ, a long-range plan in which everything would be brought together and summed up in him, everything in deepest heaven, everything on planet earth.

It's in Christ that we find out who we are and what we are living for. Long before we first heard of Christ and got our hopes up, he had his eye on us, had designs on us for glorious living, part of the overall purpose he is working out in everything and everyone.

The Dream quickly tarnished—The Fall - Adam and Eve story God's dream was indomitable!


Covenants----God's intentional relationships

Jesus is the Divine reminder of the DREAM!




Jesus the Dream Keeper of the Father

Grace and Discernment


