The rule and life of the Secular Franciscans is this: to observe the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ by following the example of Saint Francis of Assisi, who made Christ the inspiration and the center of his life with God and people.

Christ, the gift of the Father's love, is the way to him, the truth into which the Holy Spirit leads us, and the life which he has come to give abundantly.

Secular Franciscans should devote themselves especially to careful reading of the gospel, going from gospel to life and life to the gospel.

### Promoting Vocations to the Secular Franciscan Order (OFS) "Tool Kit"

All Secular Franciscans are all responsible for promoting vocations. You may be wondering – how do I do it or where do I begin? Here are some tools that may help:

- 1. Pray for vocations.
  - a. Pray the National Prayer for Vocations each day! Cards with the prayer in <u>English</u>, <u>Korean</u>, <u>Spanish</u>, or <u>Vietnamese</u> are available.
  - b. Add petitions for vocations to your morning and evening prayer routine. Distribute to your fraternity members. Petitions are available in <a href="English">English</a>, <a href="Korean">Korean</a> and <a href="Spanish">Spanish</a>.
- Promotional brochures Click here for a template for a promotional brochure in <u>English</u>, <u>Korean</u> or <u>Spanish</u>. Fill it out with your fraternity specifics (gathering location/date/time). With permission from the pastor, leave in the back of the church. Share it with other Catholics (including family and coworkers). Post a copy on your fraternity website.
- Business Cards develop professional looking cards with your fraternity name and contact information.
- Spread the word using social media. Like us on Facebook (Secular Franciscans NAFRA, USA], follow us on Twitter (@SecFranNAFRA) and watch and share Testimonials on YouTube Channel (https://www.youtube.com/user/SecularFranciscans)
- 5. Hold a Come & See event. Plan an event for people in your area to learn about the Order. This takes planning, preparation, advertising, but can be a wonderful way to spread the word. Click here for a suggested outline in English. Korean, and Spanish, with talking points for the event and an example PowerPoint Presentation with handouts. If you had some success, consider holding it annually. If you didn't have success, consider revamping the structure and trying it again. Share some of the testimonials from the YouTube Channel. Please share the outcome with us at 1.800.Francis@mail.com.
- 6. Practice your "elevator speech" about your vocation. (what does it mean to you? Why are you a Secular Franciscan? What does that "T" around your neck mean?) Example: "I am a follower of the teachings of Jesus Christ. Another man followed him in the 13<sup>th</sup> Century Francis Of Assisi. Have you heard of him? Francis fell in love with Jesus' teaching of peace, love and forgiveness the Gospel. This is a way of life for all. I found it, rather it found me a few years ago. It is so rewarding to live by example, to help others according to the Scriptures... As we say...Gospel to Life and Life to Gospel. There is more to learn would you like to get together to talk about it further?" Click here for example questions to inspire your testimonial.
- 7. Record your own testimony and send it to <a href="mailto:1.800.Francis@mail.com">1.800.Francis@mail.com</a> for posting to the Secular Franciscans YouTube Channel.

Let us know what has worked well for you. Remember the best way to spread the word about vocations is personal witness and invitation. So, while you are living the Rule by spreading Christ's peace and joy to others, it may be a good time to share about the vocation too!

rejoicing over the good things of others just as over our own


and compassionating them in evils and giving offense to no one (cf. 2 Cor 6:3)...



#### **Who are Secular Franciscans?**

The Secular Franciscan Order (OFS) is a branch of the worldwide Franciscan Family. We are single and married. We work, worship and play in the community where we live.

An official Order within the Roman Catholic Church, the OFS was founded by St. Francis of Assisi almost 800 years ago. Our purpose is to bring the gospel to life where we live and where we work. We look for practical ways to embrace the gospel in our lives and try to help others to do likewise.

In today's world we are plagued by time schedules, projects and activities that leave us tense and stressed. The OFS becomes our place of refuge and renewal where our brothers and sisters offer Francis to support and inspire us. You, too, can become a lifetime member of our family -- if God is calling you.

#### What do Secular Franciscans Do?

Secular Franciscans follow the OFS rule that requires us to spend time in community with our Franciscan brothers and sisters.

We gather at least monthly. We support each other through the ups and downs of daily life. We pray together. We take opportunities to learn about our Church, our community and our world.

Our rule mandates us to be involved in apostolic ministries and with youth. When we are called to action, we embrace the call joyfully. Some of us are religious education teachers, some have a special ministry to animals, some have made a commitment to Perpetual Adoration. Some work with the poor and homeless. Some work in Soup Kitchens or visit the elderly and sick; some have youth ministries.

As a fraternity, we take action on issues that affect the lives of others. We do letter-writing campaigns in response to social justice issues; we support the efforts of our brothers and sisters who are serving the poor and lepers half-way around the world.

#### Is the OFS for you?

If you have a Franciscan vocation, you probably have a desire to do something more. Perhaps you feel a need for support in growing spiritually. Or, deep down, you sense a need to serve God in a special way. Or, for years, you have felt an affinity with St. Francis. He seems to pop up all around and you just don't know why. Perhaps, God is calling you!

Getting to know the OFS better may be a way to determine if you have a vocation.

You'll have plenty of time to get to know us before you make any formal commitment (profession). The OFS requires at least nine months for orientation and inquiry. During that time, you'll attend our monthly gatherings and have a few informal classes. Then if you feel the call to continue, you will enter Candidacy and have another 18 to 36 months of formal discussion, education and fraternal involvement before you make a permanent commitment at the time of Profession.

### "Come & See" Event Suggested Logistics, Outline and Talking Points March 2018



Your fraternity is interested in spreading the word about the OFS and the members would like to host a "Come & See" event. Many formats can be successful. This document contains one example format with some <u>suggestions</u> for planning and organizing the event. These are just suggestions – an example for you to use to plan such an event. These are not required to any extent. Create an event that meets the characteristics of your fraternity.

#### **Pre-event Planning:**

Start planning the event at least six months ahead of time.

- Set a date,
- o Arrange for a location,
- Develop the agenda (suggested outline and talking points are provided below) include times for each portion of the agenda. Set a time limit for the event. This is an introduction. Don't expect to cover the entire three years of formation in one afternoon or evening. Suggest that talks be no longer than 15 minutes each. The prayer and information segments should be no more than 60 minutes with time for social afterwards.
- Assign speakers topics and have them prepare and practice talks, and
- Advertise for the event (e.g. bulletins, pulpit announcements at your parishes, diocesan papers, leave business cards in the back of parishes with information about the date).
- Assign people to set up, prepare a sign-in sheet, bring handouts, bring refreshments, clean-up.
- Arrange for audio-video equipment if necessary.
- Ask each member to invite people to the event.

#### Day of Event:

- Get there early to set up.
- Put up signs to direct people to the room.
- Set up a sign-in table with sign-in sheet with members to greet visitors
- Set up refreshments and any audio-visual equipment.
- o Go over with presenters the flow of the event.

#### After the Event:

- o Contact the persons who attended.
- o Invite them to a regular gathering.
- Let them know about the next steps.

#### Suggested Agenda

Prayer Service Welcoming

Social Time – one on one. Make sure your members are ready to share their testimonies one-on-one. Ask the visitors about their journeys and what moved them to come to the session.
